

# WASHINGTON IS PLACED ON BALLOT BY COUNCIL

## EDITORIAL

The attempt by certain members of the city council to bar me from the May 2 ballot never had any basis in fact or in law; it was and is a fake issue agitated for the sole purpose of hampering my campaign.

The truth is that the politicians who have been promoting this disgraceful attempt to prevent the people of the seventh district from choosing their own representative did not believe that I would win in the primary.

They reckoned without the persuasive appeal of my record and my platform and the sense of fair play on the part of seventh district residents. Surprised at the results they are seeking for any issue that will defeat me.

They dare not join issue on my platform; they can pick no flaws in my record.

Let me reiterate that I am seeking votes only on that record and that platform. Briefly, I repeat, I stand for:

Protection and extension of municipal ownership of public utilities; protection of civil rights and civil liberties; protection of the right of labor to organize and bargain collectively without being hampered by anti-picketing legislation; extension of recreational and health facilities; equal treatment of the entire district in public improvements; genuine reform in civil service to abolish all favoritism; economy but not at the expense of low paid workers and a real program of slum clearance for the entire city.

Through this newspaper I have fought consistently for many years for adequate old age pensions, for social security, for labor's rights, against discrimination and for the very aims set forth in my platform. I believe that I can fight even more effectively for those things as a member of the city council and I seek votes on that basis.

I have repeatedly stated that I welcome a judicial determination of the question of my residence. My opponents have not brought a lawsuit because they know they cannot win. They know I can establish my residence in court and for that reason they tried to disfranchise you through sneaking and underhand means.

Their actions will, I believe, prove a boomerang. The people of this district know now how desperately I am being fought by special interests and defeated candidates and the people will rise to the occasion.

The residence issue is behind us. Before us lies the task of inducing every voter of this district to go to the polls on May 2 and vote. The only thing that could possibly defeat me would be a staying at home of the voters.

Your task now is to prepare to vote on May 2 and to urge your neighbor to do likewise. Let us redouble our efforts to smash the conspiracy to defraud the seventh district of their right to be represented in city council by a councilman of their own choosing. The way to do that is to work unceasingly between now and May 2 for a 100 per cent vote in the seventh district. The job is yours. You can do it.

### Action on Mob Bill Is Asked

76 Congressmen Ask Committee Report On Lynch Measure

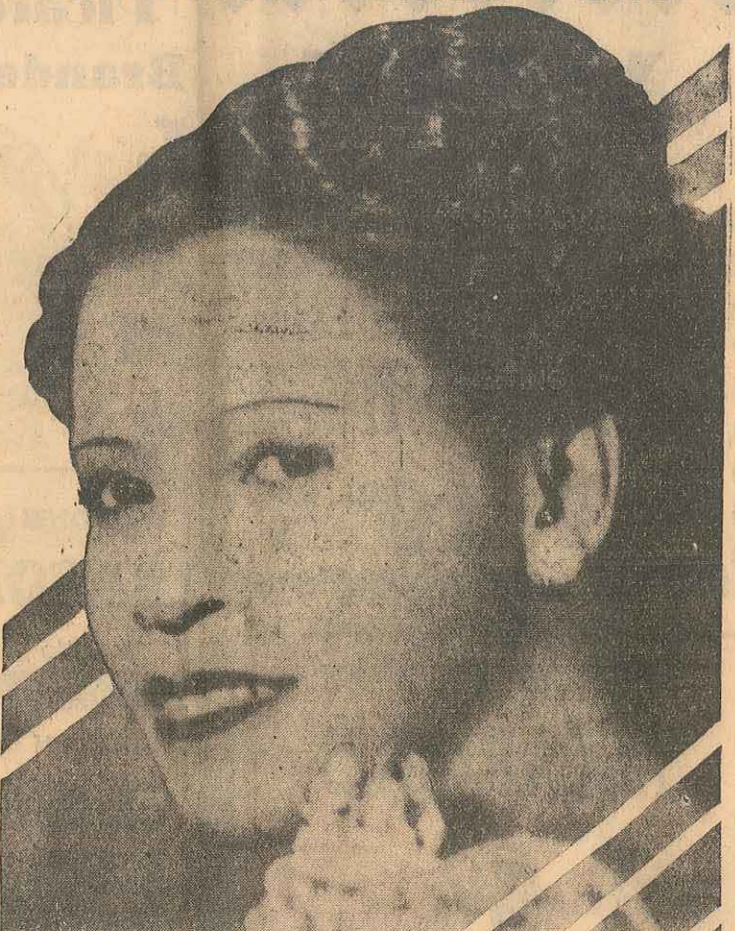
NEW YORK—Seventy-six Congressmen have signed the Gavagan discharge petition to bring the New York representative's anti-lynching bill (H.R. 801) to the floor of the House for a vote, officials of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People announced here today.

Representative Joseph Gavagan, (D. N.Y.) author of the bill who led the fight in the House in the spring of 1937 when his anti-lynching bill was finally passed, said he felt confident that the full quota of 218 signatures, necessary to bring the bill to the floor, would be forthcoming within a very short period.

URGE SENATE CLOTURE VOTE

The N.A.A.C.P. urged individuals and organizations to send telegrams and cards to their senators urging them to vote for limitation of debate (cloture), when the Wagner-Van Nuys-Capper bill (S-845) companion measure to the Gavagan bill, comes up for a vote in the Senate. A vote for cloture will help to prevent a filibuster, which southern senators have vowed they will bring to bear again in order to kill the bill in the Senate by preventing its coming to a vote on the floor.

### TVA Bias Gets Rap In Report

Power Authority Gets Blame for Treatment Of Negro Workers

NEW YORK—While a majority of the Joint Congressional committee, which has been investigating the Tennessee Valley Authority for the past nine months, voted to uphold the work of this federal agency criticism was levelled at the TVA for permitting gross discrimination in the employment and treatment of Negro workers, according to the committee's report released this week.

Pointing to the fact that discrimination is not in the policy of the Authority but nevertheless is exercised in practice the report said:

"On! paper the Authority policy toward Negroes is one of no discrimination and a proportionate share of jobs. In practice the Authority has not felt able to enforce this policy as fully as could be desired. The Authority cannot solve the race problem in a year or in 10 years, but it can and should do more for the Negroes than it is doing."

In making this last assertion the report backed up the testimony of Charles H. Houston, who testified at a public hearing on the TVA conducted at Knoxville, Tenn., in August, 1938, as a representative of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People: On

### Editor Will Be On Ballot

Volunteers Flock to Assist Campaign as Discredited Politicians Fail in Effort to Remove Leon Washington From May 2 Ballot; Victory in Finals is Assured

The name of Leon H. Washington, Jr., will appear on the May 2 ballot as the nominee for city council from the seventh district. That was the official decision of the city council Wednesday after two days of sneaking and underhand attempts to remove Mr. Washington from the ballot. He led the ticket in the primary election.

Washington opponents tried to induce the city council to disqualify him by the refusal to issue a certificate of nomination, an action that sent more than three hundred indignant citizens to council chambers Tuesday to protest the action.

The move began Monday with the passage of a resolution, introduced by Councilman Steve Cunningham calling for an opinion from the city attorney as to Washington's eligibility. Immediately upon hearing of the resolution, Mr. Washington appeared at the city attorney's office with his attorney, Loren Miller, to demand open hearings on any such charges. They contended successfully that the city council had no jurisdiction to act on the question of qualification and that any question of residence was a matter for the courts.

When the council convened Tuesday morning Council President Robert Burns read a letter from the city attorney asserting that there were no facts on which he, the city attorney, could base a decision. The letter drew vicious applause from

## For King As F.D.R. Guest

WASHINGTON—Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt indicated this week that Marian Anderson, Negro contralto whom the Daughters of the American Revolution barred from Constitution hall, probably will sing at the White House before King George and Queen Elizabeth of Great Britain.

Miss Anderson, standing on the steps of the memorial to Abraham Lincoln, sang to 75,000 persons here yesterday, scoring a triumph such as is realized by few artists.

Mrs. Roosevelt, who resigned from the DAR in protest against refusal to allow Miss Anderson use of the hall, said at a press conference that plans are being made to present a program of distinctive American music during the White House visit of the British monarchs in June.

Mrs. Roosevelt said that no formal invitations yet have been extended to anyone to sing before King George and Queen Elizabeth here, but Miss Anderson probably will be on the program.

The first lady will speak July 2 at Richmond, Va., before a meeting of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. She said she has read that she will be asked to present to Miss Anderson the Spingarn medal, awarded annually to a member of the Negro race for outstanding achievement. If asked to do so, she said, she will be glad to make the presentation.

Miss Anderson was introduced by Secretary of Interior Harold L. Ickes, who, after the DAR and school ban, arranged for the concert on the steps of the Lincoln memorial.

## Allen Campaign Gains Support

The campaign of Miss Fay E. Allen is gaining support throughout the entire city, according to reports from the Fay Allen campaign headquarters released by Mrs. Gilbert W. Lindsay, director of activities.

"Negroes make up 10 per cent of the population of the Valley area. About 11 per cent of the Authority employees are Negroes, but they receive only 7 per cent of the pay roll. Mrs. Stralvey who persists in calling all Negro women by their first name assigns one reason for her attitude: "We don't call Negro women 'Mrs.' in the South; I am a southern woman and I will never call a Negro woman 'Mrs.'" she says.

These and other complaints in reference to the general hospital were leading certain physicians to demand an investigation of the entire situation, The Sentinel heard this week.

Wednesday, Councilman Cunningham renewed his attempts to disqualify Washington by urging the council to refuse a certificate of nomination, a move opposed by Councilmen Earl C. Gay, Evan Lewis, James Hyde, Byron Brainard and others. The council refused action.

Charging that the entire action was a desperate campaign maneuver, Attorney Miller today challenged Washington opponents to take the matter to the courts.

"The city council never had any jurisdiction in the matter," Mr. Miller said. "Records of the registrar of voters show that Mr. Washington registered at 203 East 45th street in March, 1936; at 973 East Vernon avenue in July, 1936 and at 1050 East 43rd Place on July 8, 1938. Each of those places is in the seventh district and we will prove before any court that those places were Mr. Washington's places of residence. Defeated and disgruntled candidates are behind this campaign maneuver to besmirch Mr. Washington. The voters will register their answer on May 2 in no uncertain terms."

Ivan Johnson, prominent attorney, stated "The situation at Jefferson is, and has been very bad, and I will lend my whole-hearted support to help clean it up." Edward Hawkins, member of the Democratic Central Committee, and parent, was thoroughly aroused. "Through my personal contact with Jefferson, I know a nasty situation exists, and there can be no straddling of the fence on the issue." Mr. Hawkins, brother of Assemblyman, Augustus Hawkins, was more than emphatic in pledging his support to the cleanup movement. Albert Patrick, president of the Southside Young Democrats, the organization which launched the investigation, stated that letters of commendation and support were pouring in from community organizations, and now that the lid is off more startling information is continually coming in from parents and alumni of Jefferson.

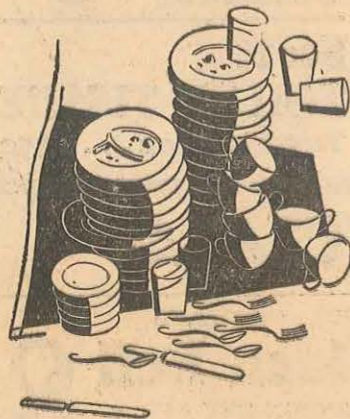
