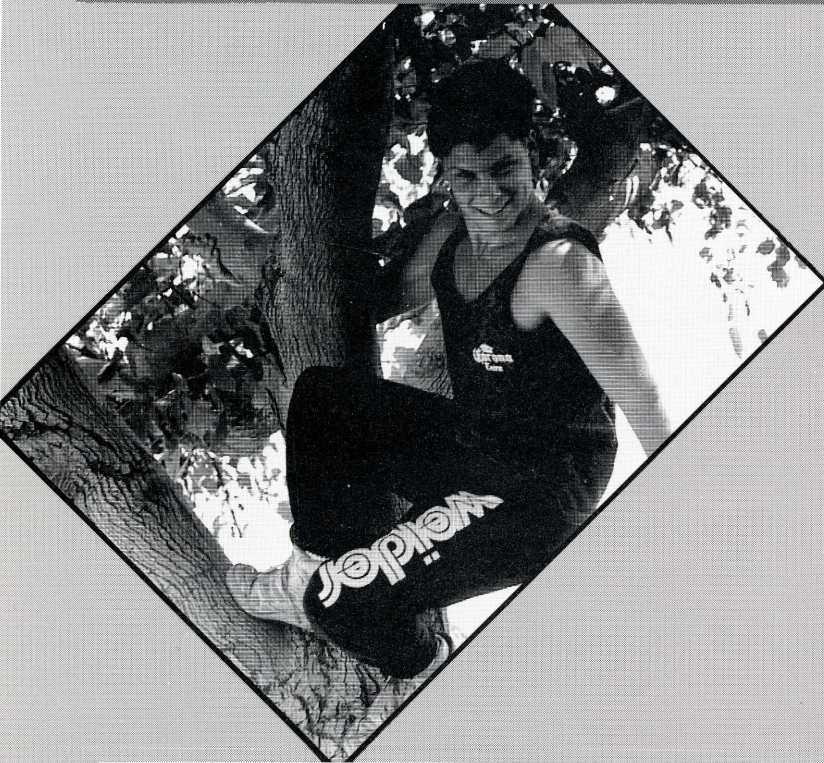
CHANCE RUTLEDGE

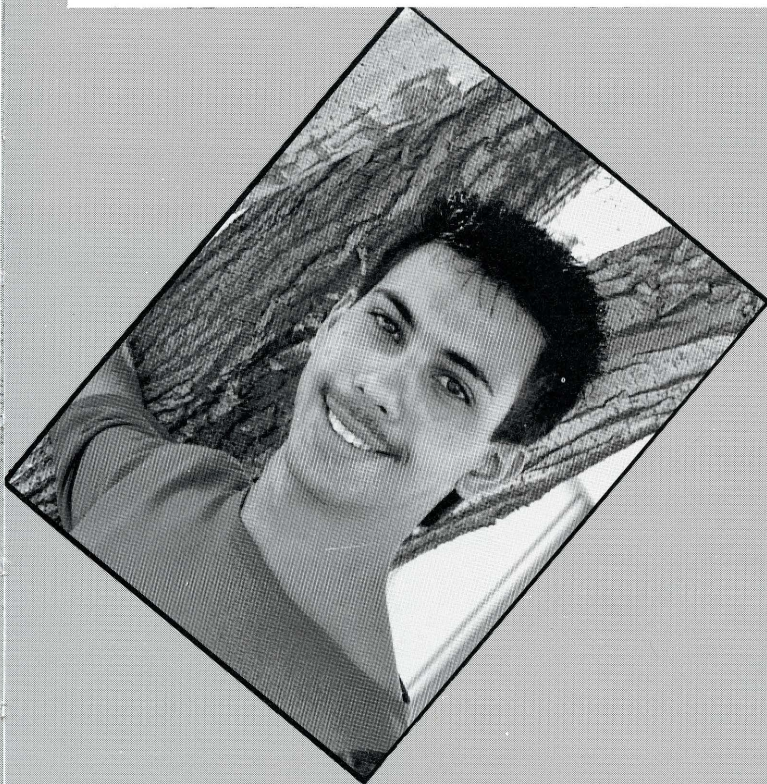


BRANDI BLUE

LYNN FORSTER: Work experience

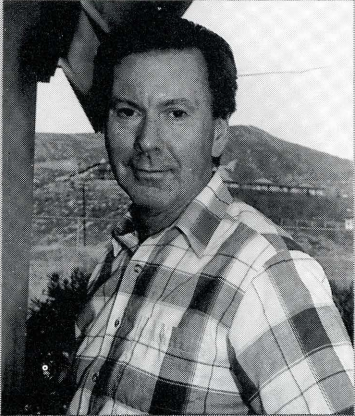
"I'll take the entire career center to the "NEW BOWMAN", where it will be expanded and hopefully more accessible to all students."

"I'm taking it all! Sixteen years of accumulated necessities have given me the reputation "If you need something, ask Fume!" I have a reputation to maintain."

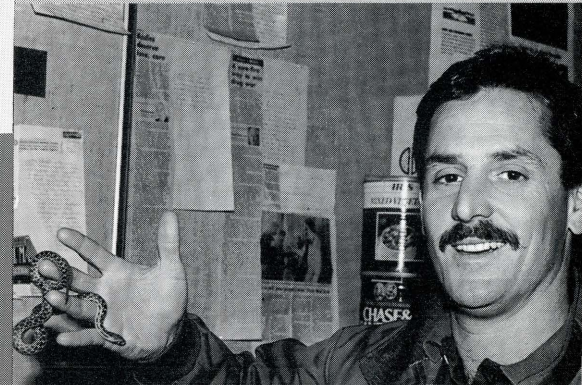


Fume is like our second mother. She tries to consider everyone's interests. She's a very good teacher. We think her special quality is her helpfulness.

SHIRLEY WHEELER: English 9A, B, 10A, B, Humanities, Intro to Poetry, Mythology, Folklore

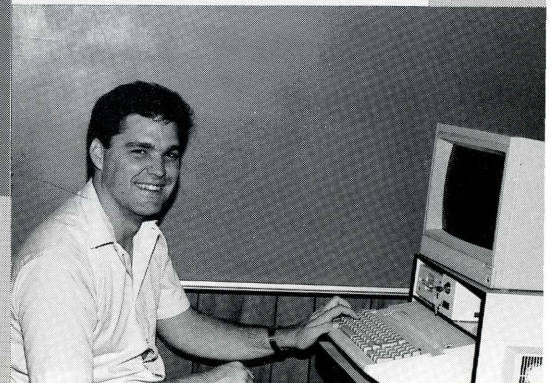
"When we move to the new school I will take with me the student photo gallery I have near my desk. In that way, I'll continue to carry the memories of Bowman students of the past with me."

"I will be taking my computer software to the new Bowman. I want to make computer use an increasingly important part of the math program, to prepare Bowman students for our technological society."

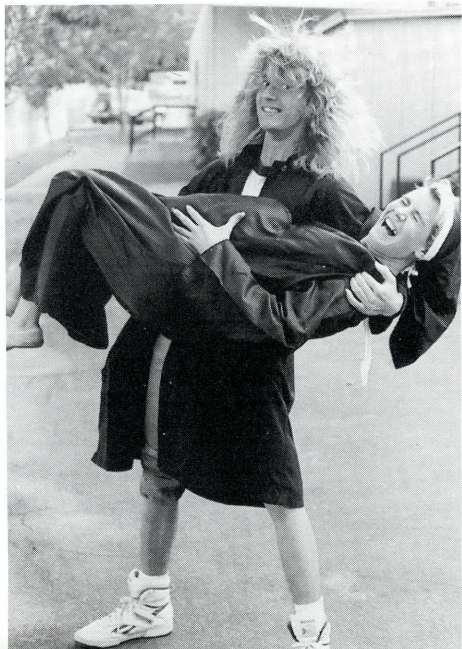
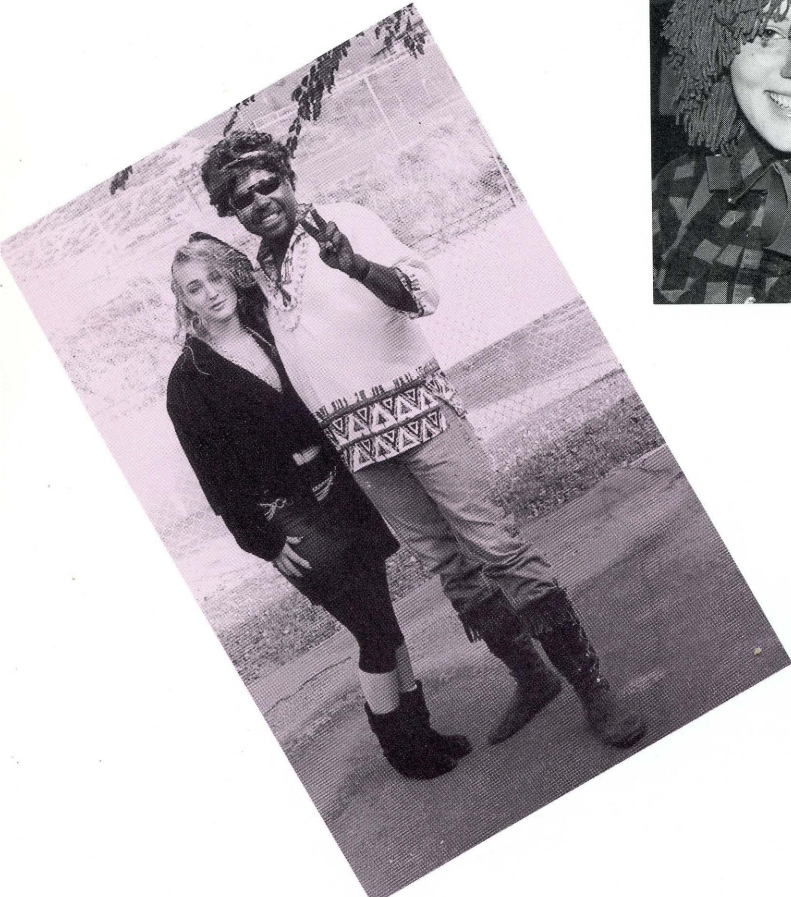

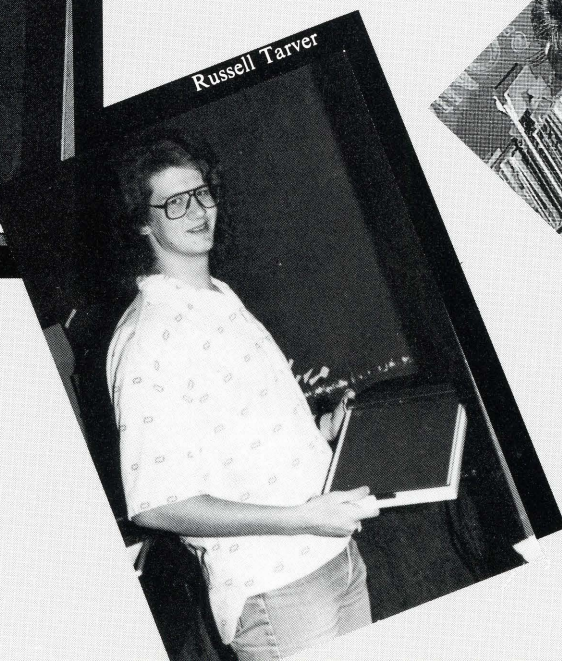
This year, a small group of people were assembled with just one purpose in mind: to create Something Special - the 10th annual "Visions" yearbook here at Bowman.

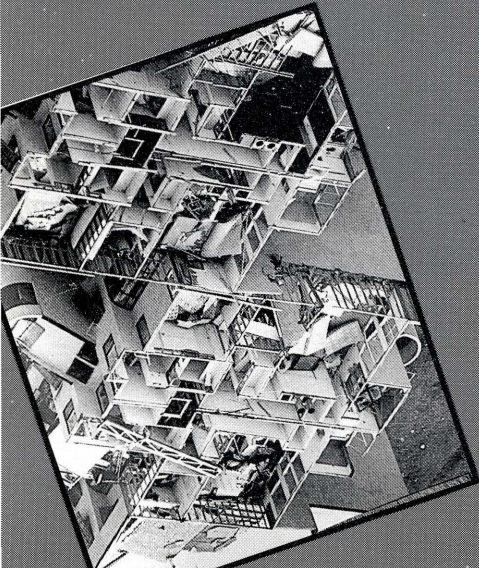
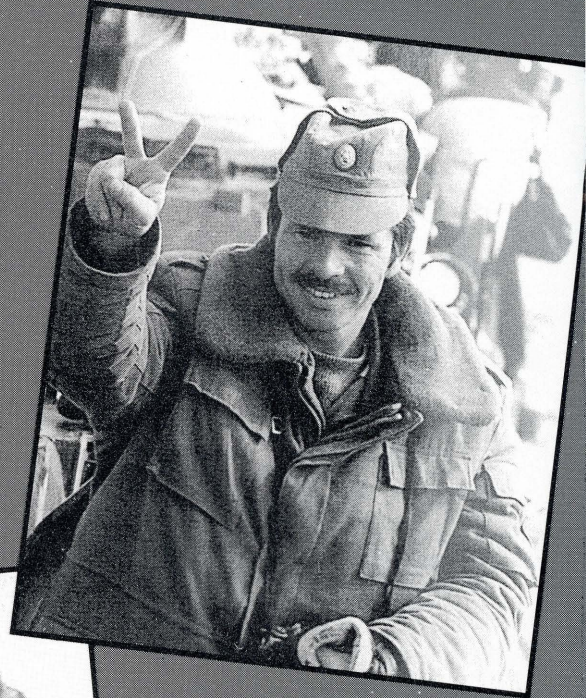
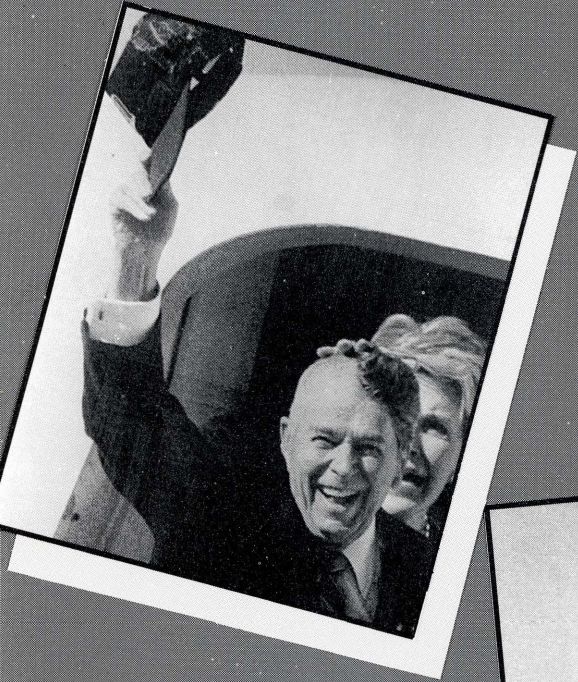


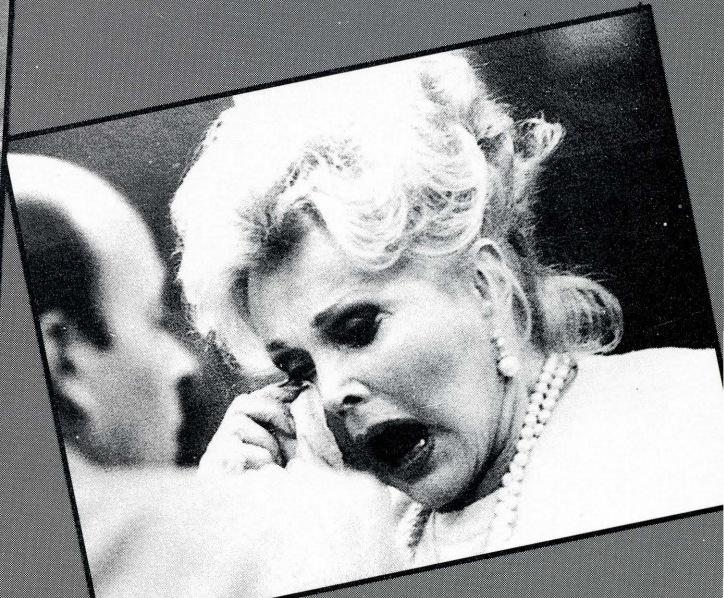
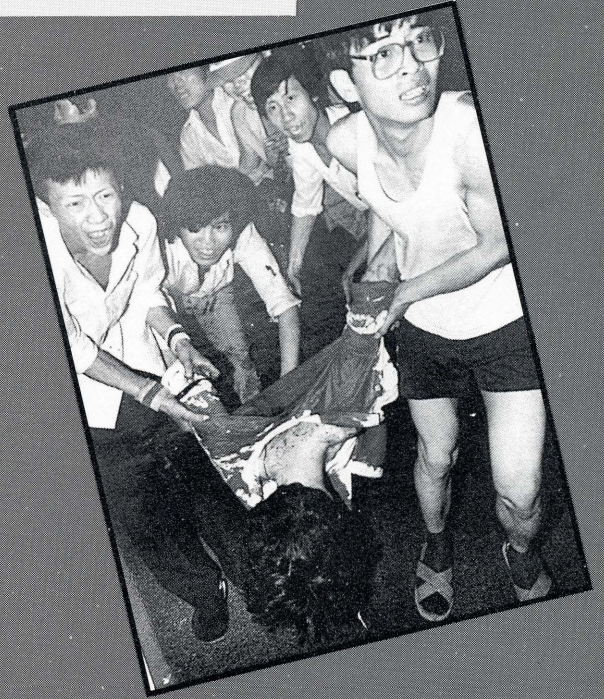
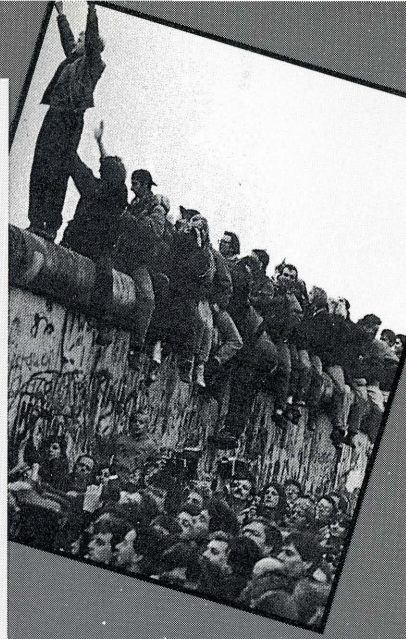


ODE TO '89
