A.S.B. and Senate

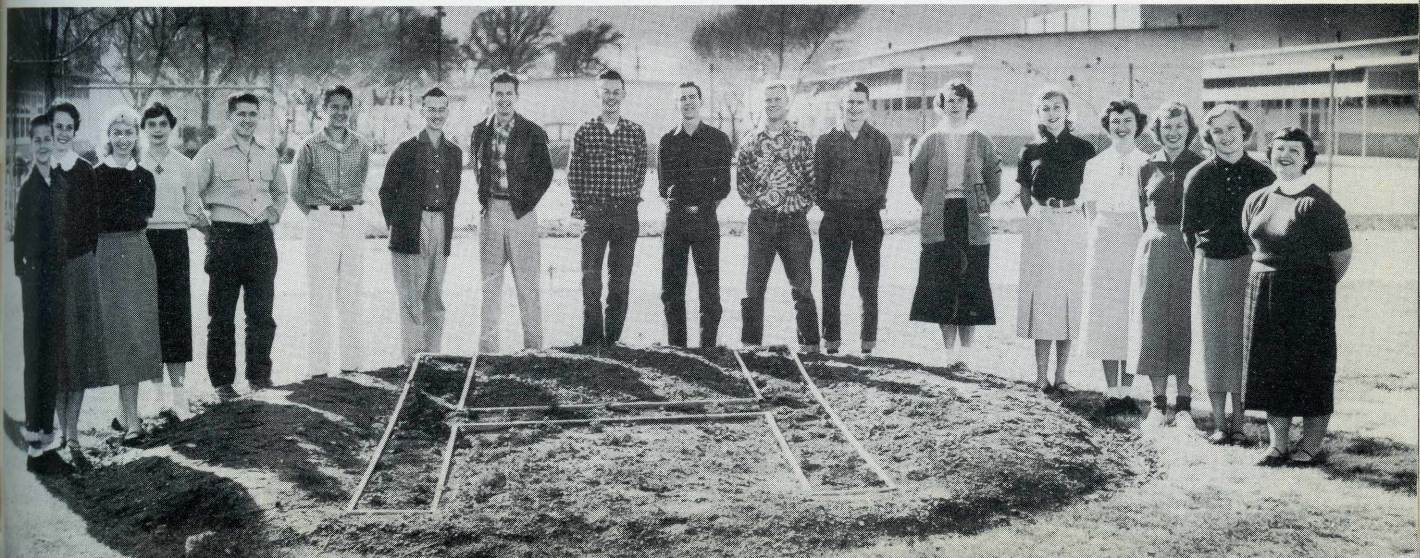

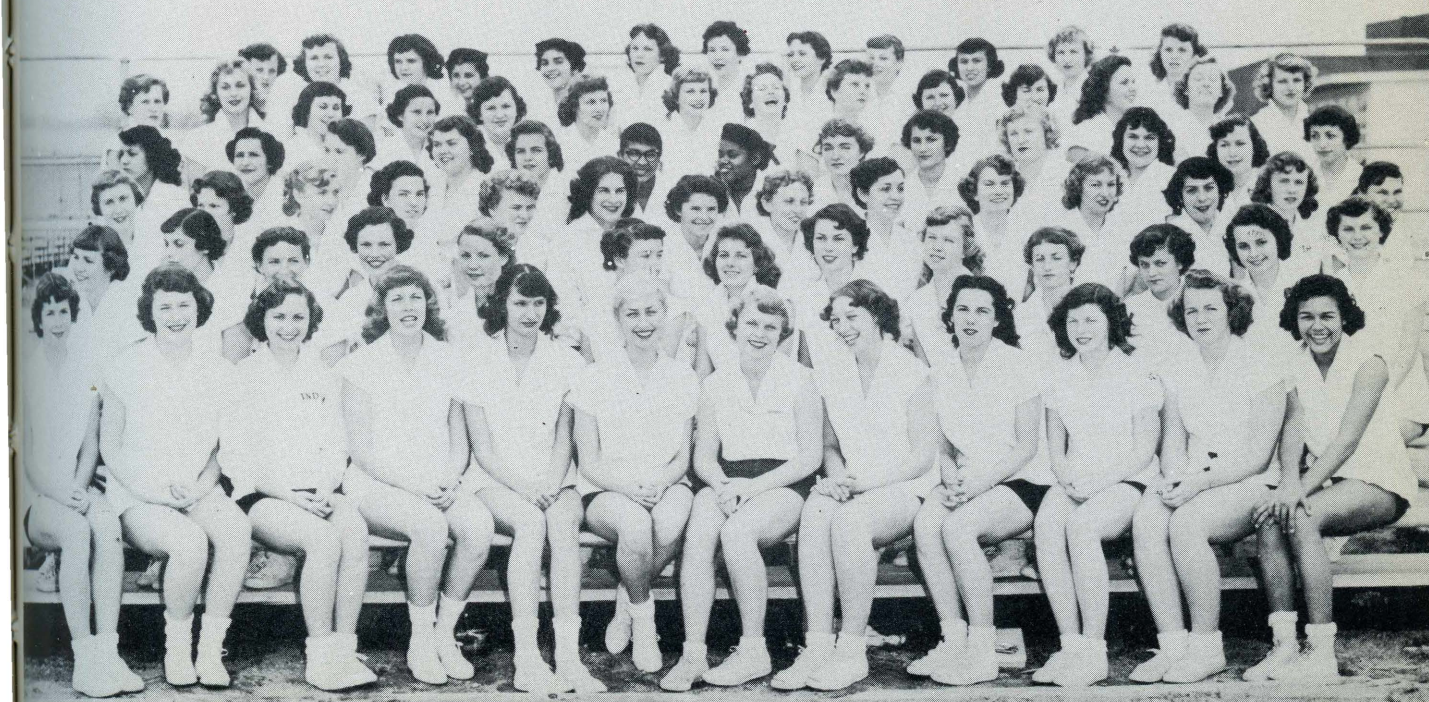

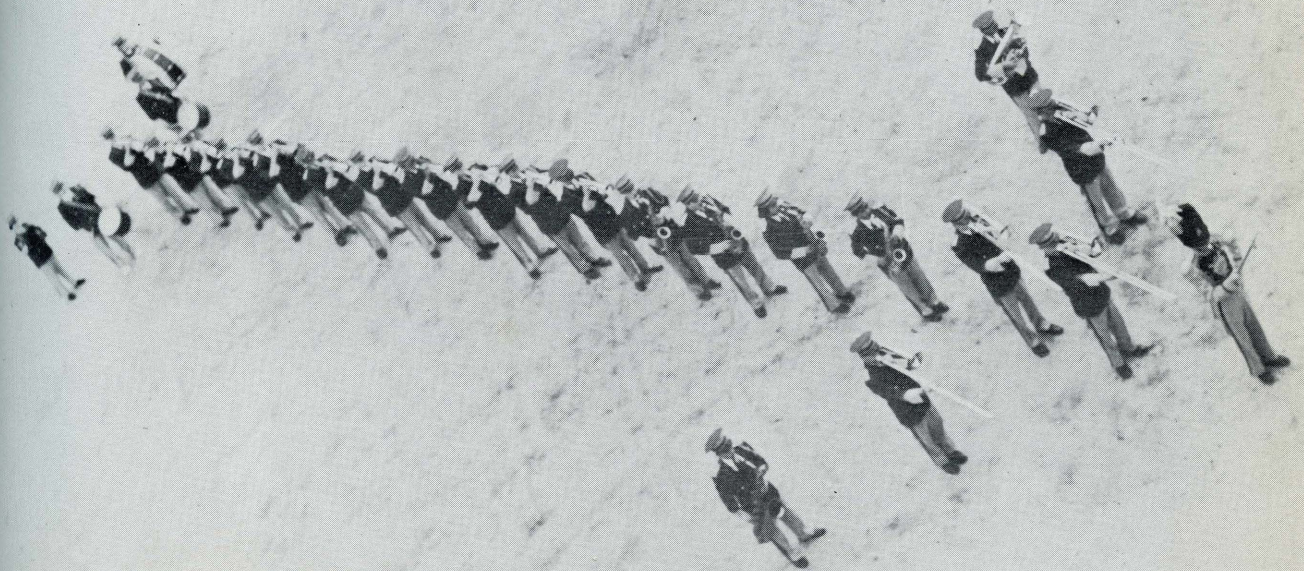


Swing Time

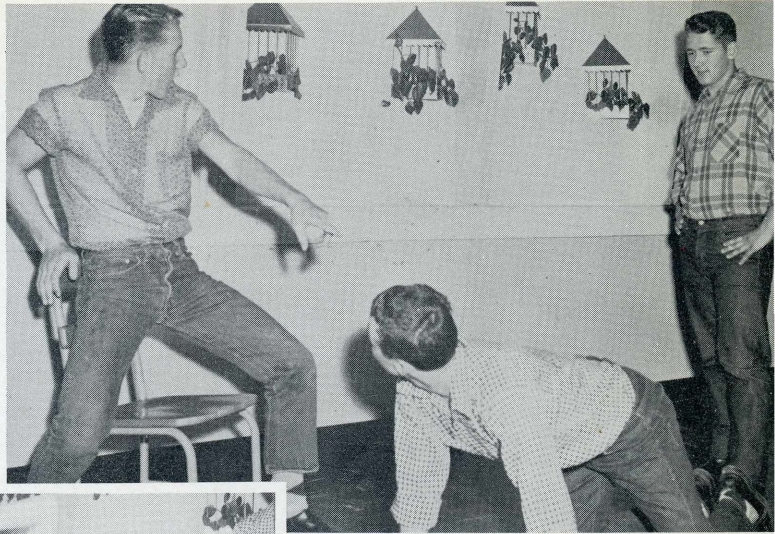

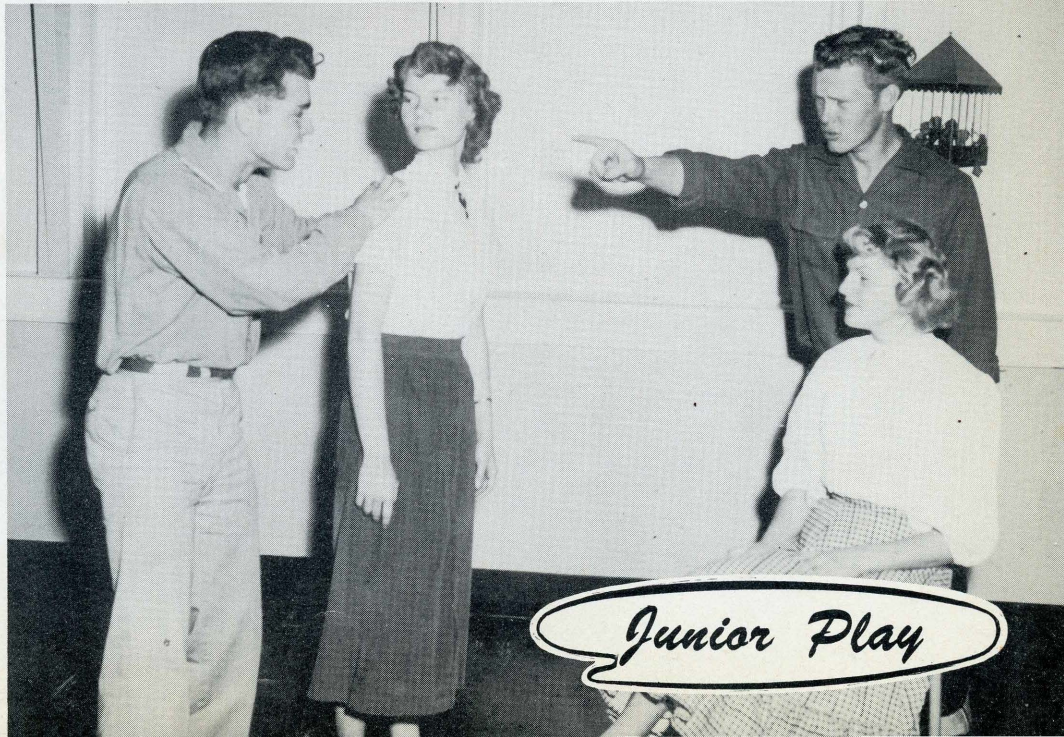

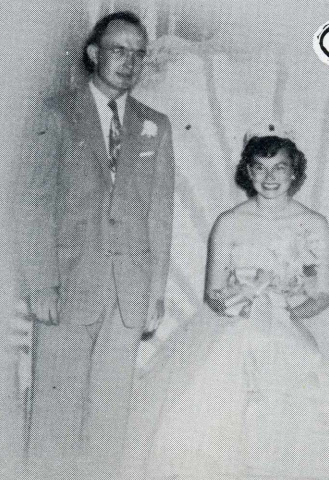
