


DEDICATION





The Varsity Club skit took top honors in the annual I.C.C. Assembly. Key Club took second place and third was the Pep Club.


The Inter-Club Council's principal objective is to promote growth and interest in student activities. Presidents of all the extracurricular organizations are members, and attend the monthly meetings.

GIRLS' LEAGUE


Establishing a criteria for the girls on campus is the main purpose of the National Girls' League Unit at Hart. In this club the girls get a chance to serve their school and community.






















