











## Jumping High




#### The Top Of The Line


































# Beauty, Brains, and Brawn ...










# Spirit Soars



































#### A Touch Of Class


### Old School Days









## "Harbor Lights"


A new senior quad was erected in the middle of school. This quad, composed of grass, trees, and benches, is enjoyed by all the students at brunch and lunch as a lounging area.

















### 177 Pints






#### Friends
