
FOREWORD







The above four people constituted the faculty of Hart High when it opened its doors for the first time in September, 1945. Mr. Johnson, Mrs. Pfister, and Mrs. Phillips served as full time employees, while Mr. Dalbey served as half time principal of the high school and half time principal of the Newhall Elementary School. Classes were held in the Newhall School Auditorium and two small rooms on the Newhall Elementary School grounds. Seventy-five students enrolled in the ninth grade made up the student body of the newly organized high school.




