


SCALE: 3'' = 1'-0''



LIVE OAK MANOR ROCK ARCH

The arch was originally constructed in 1926 to attract visitors to Olmstead's Live Oak Manor Cacti Gardens, a point of interest frequented by tourists and sightseers along the "old" San Fernando Road. The stones in this arch were specially selected by Mr. Olmstead, and it took him several years to make the collection. The stone arch was relocated by Olmstead in 1930, due to the creation of Sierra Highway and the changes to the intersection with Remsen Road. In 1939, Olmstead closed his gardens and moved to Los Angeles, where he died in 1945.
